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Introduction



This report outlines the findings of a youth engagement project carried out in collaboration with Pittenweem Primary school and Pittenweem Community Council in March 2023. The project was an interim 'stepping stone' stage in the process while the community council seek out options for a full Local Place Plan exercise. It was supported by the Rural Ideas into Action Fund.

The aim was to engage with local children and encourage them to share their thoughts and ideas on the place they live in. We worked with the children on 10 March and 23 March, running a project logo competition and a "Two Stars and A Wish" activity. The former encouraged children to think creatively about what makes their community unique and come up with a name and image for a potential Local Place Plan engagement project. The latter allowed them to share what they loved about Pittenweem through drawing and/or writing and what they would like to see changed.


We also attended Pittenweem's Sustainability Festival to showcase the children's work and gather further ideas from grown-ups in attendance.

We produced a short video to accompany this report, featuring the children sharing their "Two stars and A Wish". This gave the local children a platform and ensured their perspectives form the core of any future consultations in Pittenweem. The findings provided valuable insights into the views and aspirations of young people in Pittenweem. By listening to their voices, we hope to contribute to a more inclusive and sustainable community that reflects the needs and desires of all its members.

Why involve young people?

Engaging with children when planning and developing places is important because they have unique perspectives and needs. They are important stakeholders and can be advocates for change. However, they historically comprise a seldom-heard group. By involving children in planning and development processes, more inclusive and child-friendly places can be created.

On 16 March 2021, the Scottish Parliament unanimously passed the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (Incorporation) (Scotland) Bill ('the UNCRC Bill' or 'the bill')(1). The bill seeks to empower our children and young people to claim their rights and help to make Scotland the best place in the world to grow up. Work is ongoing to implement the UNCRC. It recognises that children have the right to participate in decisions that affect them, to express their views, and to have their opinions taken seriously. This engagement exercise demonstrates a commitment to integrating the UNCRC, by actively hearing the views and voices of the children into the future development of Pittenweem.

Fife Council is currently undertaking work to produce its next Local Development Plan (2) (LDP) A Local Development Plan is a 20-year plan covering each council area in Scotland. They are reviewed every 10 years. The LDP allocate sites, either for new development - such as housing or sites - to be protected. LDPs guide decisions on all planning applications. As part of the upcoming Fife LDP, Fife Council hired PAS (Planning Aid Scotland) to gather the ideas, opinions, and suggestions of young Fife residents. The project, named #FocusOnFife,echoes suggestions from the Pittenweem Youth Engagement, including improved play park facilities, shopping and leisure facilities.

A Local Place Plan for Pittenweem would be valuable for emphasising the views of young people in Pittenweem. A Local Place Plan would then have a role in informing the Local Development Plan.

The Engagement Activity

Logo Activity

The logo competition engaged students from Pittenweem Primary School in the creation of a logo for the prospective Pittenweem Local Place Plan. The students attended a short assembly where we introduced them to Local Place Plans. We explained that we wanted them to produce a logo (name and picture) showing "what makes Pittenweem Pittenweem". We provided examples of similar logos as inspiration. We were also joined by David Stutchfield from the Community Council who provided an overview to the role of the Community Council.

The pupils designed logos with their teachers' support. The top logo from each class was submitted to the community council, who selected their favourite one to represent the Local Place Plan.

The competition provided an opportunity for the students to contribute to the development of their community through thinking about what makes their place unique. They showcased their creativity and design skills, both through artistic means and drawing on literary techniques to develop catchy names.

The logo will serve as a visual representation of the aspirations of the Local Place Plan and represents the value young people have in their community.



Two stars and A Wish

To capture what the children liked about Pittenweem and ideas they have for the future, we ran an activity called "Two Stars and A Wish".

The activity provided an opportunity for students to share their thoughts and ideas on Pittenweem in a familiar, accessible format. We introduced the activity through a short assembly, and provided each class with worksheets that summarised the activity.

The students were asked to identify two things they liked about Pittenweem ("two stars") and one thing that they would like to see improved ("a wish"). This acted as a framework to express their positive experiences and provide constructive feedback on their area.

The activity encouraged young people to think critically about their community and actively participate in the development of their local area. The findings will help to inform future planning decisions and ensure that the voices of young people are taken into consideration.

Below is a table of the top responses from the pupils.

The above table summarises the top ten 'stars' from the pupil's responses. These summarise the comments which came up most frequently in this category. A full summary of all the 'stars' can be found in the appendix.

In 2022 a Community Survey was conducted in Pittenweem with 174 responses being received. Respondents reported the following:

'Most significant of all, 43% of respondents value Pittenweem's strong sense of community.

Also seen as important (by around 25% of respondents each) are:

- the town's history and beauty as a historic burgh
- its tranquillity and slow pace of life
- its friendliness and welcoming atmosphere.

Not far behind (at around 17% of responses each) are:


- the rural and coastal location and scenery
- the number and diversity of great places to eat for a small town
- the fact that the working harbour and its fishing remains at its heart.'

These aspects are echoed in the primary school's responses with appreciation from the pupils being demonstrated for the town's seaside identity (the tidal pool, harbour, and beach) and their sense of community through the community and their school.

The children detailed their gratitude for child-friendly spaces such as play parks and football spaces.

As seen in the table above, there is strong fondness for the ice cream shop – 'Sweetie Johns'. This indicates that not only is the shop a place for the pupils to get treats, but it is also an environment which is welcoming to children.

While the children's and adults' responses largely reflected similar sentiments, the children in particular detailed their appreciation and desire for child-oriented spaces, from Sweetie John's to the playparks.



Wishes



This table outlines what pupils would like to change about Pittenweem – their wishes.

The top wish relates to improving the range of shops and restaurants available in Pittenweem. Suggestions from the children specifically included fast food outlets such as Krispy Kreme or Greggs and shops including a gem shop, a book shop, and a larger supermarket such as Sainsbury's.

This comment in particular deviates from the main concerns raised in the initial Pittenweem Community Survey. The priorities for change in the community survey included:

- addressing road maintenance issues (11%)
- increasing the availability of affordable housing (10%)
- implementing and expanding access to multi-use paths between the East Neuk villages (9%)
- repairing and upgrading playparks for kids (8%).

However, as was raised in the community survey the children also expressed desires for improved play park facilities. Further, many of the other 'wishes' from the children also refer to spaces that are suitable for play and fun.

Finally, there was also an interest from the children for improved bin and recycling facilities.

Conclusions from "Two Stars and A Wish"

The slight differences in priorities between the general community survey and the children's activity indicates the value of offering the young people the space to share their ideas and experiences. It is also worth noting that five pupils stated on their sheet that they did not want Pittenweem to change.



The Sustainability Festival

The logos from the competition and the range of responses from the "Two Stars and A Wish" activity were showcased at the Sustainability Festival on the afternoon of 23 March.

We invited visitors to the stand to share their views and ideas. The table below shares the top six 'wishes' that were shared on the post-it notes on the table.

There are some differences between the priorities of the primary school pupils and those who visited the stand. However, there is also joint interest in the improvement of the play facilities and the range of business and shops available.



Conclusion and Next Steps

Involving the primary school students in the programme is essential in ensuring that a diverse range of voices, and therefore ideas which represent the community accurately, are captured in plans for making changes in Pittenweem.

The logo activity will ensure that there is a strong connection between the engagement of the Local Place Plan and the young people of Pittenweem.

The "Two Stars and A Wish" activity will help shape preliminary engagement and ideas which may emerge during the process Local Place Plan. The information gathered during this activity will also serve as an evidence base should members of the community be interested in pursuing funding or support to deliver any of the actions outlined.

Further, the video can be used to promote the activity, relationship with the school, and the voice of children in the process.

Responding to the feedback from children and young people at this stage, and beyond, can support Pittenweem in continuing to be a great place to grow up.




